





WISEatlantic met with faculty and students at Acadia University and UPEI to discuss supporting gender equity in STEM in September 2013.

Girls Get WISE Science Retreat for African Nova Scotian Youth was held on October 2nd 2013. Forty girls enjoyed hands-on activities including DNA extraction and learning about jobs from female role models in STEM. In partnership with the Halifax Regional School Board.

3rd Gender Summit -North America

The 3rd North American Gender Summit took place from November 13-15th 2013 in Washington D.C. The theme of this year's gender summit was "Diversity Fueling Excellence in Research and Innovation".

The summit attracted over 600 participants and speakers from all over the world in a Call to Action to achieve positive change towards greater diversity in the STEM workforce. All five NSERC Chairs for Women in Science and Engineering were present at the Summit and were involved as speakers in various panel sessions. The CWSE's funded delegates from their respective regions to attend the Summit. WISEatlantic sponsored three individuals to attend.

Highlights from the week included an inspiring talk from Astronaut and Chief Operating Officer of the Montreal Science Centre, Julie Payette and a discussion about implicit gender bias from Dr. Brian Nosek, co-founder of Project Implicit (projectimplicit.net). 
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Dr. Tamara Franz-Odendaal - Nova Scotia Science, Technology and Innovation Champion
