### Women in Science Speaker Tour

In collaboration with Science Atlantic, WISEatlantic will be hosting the Women in Science Speaker Tour this fall.

The purpose of the Women in Science Speaker Tour is to showcase the research conducted by female faculty in Atlantic Canada. Female faculty represent only about 25-30% of all faculty in the physical and life sciences, mathematics, and computer sciences in Canada, but are important role models for female students.



A different scientific discipline will be featured in each speaker tour. Two tours will be run per academic year, with each speaker visiting three or more Science Atlan-

### **5th Annual Girls Get WISE Science Summer Camp**



The fifth annual Girls Get WISE Science Summer Camp took place at Mount Saint Vincent University from July 18-22<sup>nd</sup>. Twenty four girls going into Grades 7 & 8 participated in a variety of **hands-on STEM activities** including: programming robots, regenerating planaria, engineer design challenges, creating polymers, and chemistry experiments, among many others. Participants were also introduced to the scientific approach through the ever-popular zebrafish component of the camp. The girls had the opportunity to chat with female STEM role models including: a Dietician, Aerospace Engineer, Physicist, Chemist, and Business Analyst.

### CCWESTT holds 16<sup>th</sup> biennial Conference in Ottawa
