
# The 10 Common Myths Girls have about STEM and How to Bust Them

#### **Twitter Basics and Networking Event**

On November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2015, thirty women studying or working in various STEM fields came together at the Mount to network and to learn the basics of Twitter. Dr. Tamara Franz-Odendaal, Chair of WISEatlantic opened the event by discusing how Twitter can be useful to women in STEM to get their voices heard about their research and to address STEM stereotypes and gender inequality. 



## **WinSETT Leadership Workshops - Professional Development**

The WinSETT Centre is currently running their full Leadership Series of professional development workshops for women in Science, Engineering, Trades and Technology at the Mount in Halifax with support from WISEatlantic, Emera



Newfoundland & Labrador, and Engineers Canada. The two first workshops in the series, Becoming Leaders and Effective Communications, were sucessfully held in October and November respectively, with 29 women participating and Donna Clark as the facilitator.
