- Dr. Franz-Odendaal attended the **CCWESTT Conference**, "Open Opportunities: Mentoring the Future" from May 22-24 in Regina, Saskatchewan. She was part of the Youth Panel and discussed WISEatlantic's major events. Other highlights included keynotes from Roberta Bondar, former Astronaut and Hayley Wickenheiser, four time Olympic gold medalist. Dr. Franz-Odendaal was also part of a panel with the other NSERC CWSE's "Call to Action NSERC".

- Girls Get Wise Science Retreat was held on May 17<sup>th</sup> at the Mount for girls in grades 7-12. Forty girls and seven role models participated in Technology and Engineering sessions.

The 21 girls had fun studying zebrafish, doing chemistry and engineering experiments, inventing android phone apps and much more! 
173 Girls interacted with 28 Role Models

## **News from Across the Region**


