Junior & Senior Girls Get WISE Science Summer Camps









Two Girls Get WISE Science Summer Camps took place at Mount Saint Vincent University this year in July and August. Thirty-nine girls in Grades 7 -10 explored science, technology, engineering and math activities through hands-on activities and experiments, and learned about careers in STEM by chatting with women working in STEM fields. The girls enjoyed tracking the development of zebrafish embryos throughout the week, participating in fun engineering design challenges, designing a lock and key with a 3D Printer with **Lockheed Martin**, making bath bombs, studying chicken embryos, and measuring the electrical activity of the brain!

Be Curious! Explore Careers with Impact



On May 14, young girls, parents, teachers and role models participated in a Science Odyssey hosted by WISEatlantic at the **Nova Scotia Community College** in Lunenburg. The girls had lots of questions for the role models and came away from the evening with lots of knowledge about the variety of STEM careers available.

Role models represented included an air traffic controller with Canadian Forces, Molecular Biologist, Chemical Engineer, and a graduate student in Mathematics and Statistics.

Partnership Events

This past June, we partnered with **Techsploration** for a unique event series celebrating Techsploration's female role models and volunteers in honour of the organization's 20th anniversary year. Approximately 40 teachers, role models, and event volunteers attended the series, which took place in Port Hawkesbury and Halifax (NSCC and Mount Saint Vincent University). Participants enjoyed an interactive and informative 90-minute WinSETT professional development workshop followed by an intimate networking reception. The series offered Techsploration a special opportunity to show their appreciation for their dedicated volunteers, including both role models and teachers.



Partnerships Program Funding

The WISEatlantic Partnerships Program is an opportunity for community organizations in Atlantic Canada to apply for **one-year sponsorships** to establish or expand programs that promote the outreach, recruitment, and retention for girls, young women, and industry professionals in science, technology, engineering or math (STEM). It is expected that projects have a plan for continuation after WISEatlantic Partnerships Program funding ends. Organizations may apply for a one year sponsorship of up to \$3000. Call for funding abstracts begins on **September 10, 2018** for projects taking place in 2019. Deadline to apply is **October 26, 2018** at midnight.


