

Another Successful STEMaware event took place on November. 5th, 2019 at Mount Saint Vincent University.

WISEatlantic hosted our third annual STEMaware event, which aims to connect High School girls and current Mount Saint Vincent University science students with past Bachelor of Science alumni. Many students are not aware of what they can do with their education, post-graduation. Nineteen students, ranging from grade nine to fourth year university, got to chat with Mount Bachelor of Science graduates about their career paths and how they are using their degrees. FLL Team Wins Award


