The NSERC Chair for Women in Science and Engineering—Atlantic Region (WISEatlantic) Program aims to shift gendered STEM stereotypes. We empower girls to consider Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM)-based careers by raising their awareness of the diversity of careers within these fields, and enabling them to visualize themselves working in these fields. WISEatlantic also supports early career women in STEM through professional development and networking opportunities.
