#### 2023 Girls Get WISE Science Retreat

On April 1, 2023 we held our annual Girls Get WISE Science Retreat at MSVU, this will also be our last retreat as Dr. Franz-Odendaal's term as NSERC Chair for Women in Science and Engineering - Atlantic comes to an end. 28 girls+ were in attendance and participated in several activities including a team engineering design activity where they had to build towers out of straws and tape so that they would hold a can of pop, a chemistry activity that explored polymers, and a biology activity that had them using clues and microscope slides to guess the object.

We ended the day with our popular role model session, where four role models chatted to the girls about their careers in Water Resource Science, Genetics Counselling, Powerline Technician, Medical Neuroscience. Thanks to all participants, role models, volunteers, session leaders, and sponsors over the years!
